
January 22, 2018 is our next workday.

MTQG GENERAL MEETING MINUTES

Monday, December 18, 2017

9:33 am - President Carol Cooley welcomed members, new members and visitors.

Approval of November minutes: Sherri Hubbs moved and Dona Speights seconded.

Announcements: Please do not park near the trash receptacle. Anyone parked there now please move your car. Please silence cell phones. Christmas luncheon today following meeting.

CHAIR REPORTS

1. Visitors - Peggy Knox for Gail Henry (absent) - There were two visitors: John Ramsey and Elizabeth Quibell

2. New Members - Diana Ramsey - One new member (declined to be introduced).

3. Youth Quilt Program (YQP) - Diana Ramsey - First session (6-weeks November-December) has been completed; students made pillowcases, Christmas stockings, and fidget quilts. Next session (8-weeks) begins January 10 to end of February. Have 6 signed up and hope to have 10 (limit) due to upcoming publicity. They still need 2 long heavy duty extension cords or power strips and more rotary cutters, preferably the newer easier to use kind, if anyone can donate them.

4. Opportunity Quilt - Diana Ramsey for Fran Leslie - They need more venues to sell tickets for the opportunity quilt. Wickenburg does not have room at their show, which will result in less revenue. The committee would like to show the quilt at craft fairs or other guild meetings, or any other appropriate venue. If any members have suggestions, please contact Fran Leslie or Lapriel Schwan.

5. Programs - Pam Easley - January: Barb Wills, an internationally known quilter specializing in silks and velvets, will present a lecture on unusual and unique quilts at the meeting, and will teach a workshop on dyeing silk scarves that will take place after the general meeting. Cost is \$25, which covers all materials. The workshop is currently full, but if enough members would like to sign up for a second session, Barb is willing to do a second workshop the following day, Tuesday. If interested, please see Pam immediately.

February: The presenter will be Debbie Sullivan, who will lecture on colors and backgrounds. She is a featured artist in the Sun City West guild. There will be no workshop in February.

9. Fun Day - Diane Stockhaus - Will be an all-day workshop on February 20. Cost is \$40 that includes all materials and lunch. There will be two colorways, Kate Fassett and batiks. Signups started today, and Diane will continue signups at January meeting if there are spaces available.

10. Newcomers Mini Group - Karen Adams - Last month the group met at Cloth Plus where Whitney talked about the quilts in her shop. Next meeting will be January 29 at Quilt & Sew Connection in PV at 10am. The topic will be new and old tools of the trade. The shop will offer a discount for shoppers. Anyone who is interested in the group but is not on the contact list may contact Karen to be added.

Announcement - Carol Cooley - Thanked members for thoughts and encouragement while her son was overseas.

11. January Winter Camp - Erin Sullivan - Will be January 16-18. Anyone who wishes hotel accommodations please see Erin right away, as the hotel will release the room block soon.

12. Boutique - Erin Sullivan - If mini-groups are making items for the boutique, please let Erin or co-chair Sue Ely know, if you haven't let them know already. She reminded members of the February ECHOS demonstration of items that can be made for the boutique.

13. Quilt Show - Linda Marley and Jan Adams - Linda - Next meeting will be Friday, January 5, at 10am at the Miller Valley Baptist Church. Gail Van Horsen will be at the Wickenburg quilt show and will be available to do appraisals. Her contact information is in older MTQG directories if anyone wants to make an appointment.

Jan - They need more "Do Not Touch the Quilts" signs for the MTQG show. Because of the AQS exhibit, they want numerous signs in that area due to the value of the quilts. The signs are to measure approximately 8x8 inches and can be creative and cute with the quilter's name on the back. They will collect them over the next few months.

Linda - They are taking entries for the small quilt auction at this time. All committees are filled, but Kay Harlan, Story Quilt chair, could use some help.

14. Thumb Butte Workshop - Carolyn Edwards - There are still two openings for the January 8th workshop on Featherweight maintenance. Cost is \$5.

15. Community Quilts - Dona Speights - Jan delivered 37 quilts last month, and they are on track to exceed last year's number, probably around 600 donated quilts this year. Thanks to all who help the Community Quilt program. They received a donation of eight large trash bags of fleece strips. Sue Ely sewed them together to make backings, which will result in considerable cost savings while producing soft quilts. The next Community Quilt meeting will be Monday January 22 at Las Fuentes. She encouraged "Come One, Come All - we will put you to work." The Hobbs batting cost has increased to \$80 per roll, so she hopes to take advantage of any possible upcoming sales at JoAnns, etc., to provide batting and avoid shipping costs.

16. Spring Camp - Dona Speights - Camp will be April 10-13. Registration starts at the February MTQG meeting. \$100 will be required to hold space, and remaining \$130 will be due at the March 19th meeting. Forms will be available in the January newsletter.
