Hello Everyone, Well we made it through the snow storm, however our Guild meeting had to be cancelled along with our activities that were planned for February. On the positive side, since we were snowed in it was a good time to get some sewing done.

At our March meeting our guest speaker will be Carolann Small from Tucson who will be giving a lecture and workshop on a Landscape wall hanging that uses fabric piecing and thread painting. We still have several openings for the workshop if you would like to sign-up. The workshop is on Tuesday, March 19th from 9:00 am to 4:00 pm (set-up at 8:30 am). Cost is \$40 payable to the guild and Carolann will have kits available for \$16 payable to her. The kit will included fused fabric (with landscape themed fabric), muslin and peltex with fused backing.

NOTE: You will need to bring a sewing machine with the ability to drop the feed dogs and several kinds of feet, and several colors of **40 weight thread**, the more the better.

In March we will be taking sign-ups for **Gina Perkes** class on ruler work (where you will need a ruler foot for your machine). She will have rulers for you to purchase, also bring any machine rulers you may have. Class is on Tuesday April 16. 2019. Cost is \$50.00 payable to the guild.

We will also be taking sign-up for **LeAnn Heilman** from Phoenix who will be teaching a Laura Heine Collage on May 20 and 21, 2019. The class is for a day and half (Monday 1:00 to 4:00 pm and Tuesday 9:00 to 4:00 pm). Cost is \$50.00 to the guild. The supply list requests you bring a Laura Heine Fiberworks pattern of your choice.


