MTQG Meeting Minutes

Monday, May 20, 2019

President Kristi McHugh called the meeting the order, reminding members to silence their cell phones and not to park up the street out of the parking lot to the south as it is a fire evacuation hazard.

Minutes and Treasurer's reports were approved after a First by Diana Ramsey and Second by Susan Perry.

Hospitality Chair Gail Henry welcomed 5 visitors. As Block of the Month Chair she also thanked those who have donated blocks that will soon be assembled into quilts for Community Quilts.

Sunshine and Shadows Chair Vicki Smola encouraged members to send sympathy cards to Ann Novak due to the death of her husband. Members with May birthdays were announced and asked to stand while the membership sang "Happy Birthday."

Marcia Jacobson welcomed 2 new members, Liz Hart and Kathy Stewart. Dues for the coming fiscal year are due before June 30th and forms are available that all need to complete.

The New Members Group will meet on Wednesday, June 5, at 1 p.m. An email will be sent soon with more specifics.

Kathy Hofmeister passed around sign-up sheets. The June Hawaiian Luau luncheon needs several hostesses as well as helpers for setup and clean up. Members were also asked to sign up to sell tickets for our Opportunity Quilt at the Thumb Butte Quilt Show on May 31 and June 1.

Peggie MacKenzie showed the MTQG's 2020 Opportunity Quilt to the members for the first time. Permission had been given by Terri Westberg to use her "Dream Tree" design. Quilted by Georgia Coffelt, the quilt was pieced and appliquéd by 15 members: Kathleen Bond, Kathy Barrett, Joan Carrell, Kay Denny, Julie Dodds, Judy Larson, Fran Leslie, Peggy MacKenzie, Jan Mawk, Marcia McMullen, Carol Miller, Barbara Phiel, Diana Ramsey, John Ramsey and Jan Smith. The label was machine embroidered by Peggy Nehring. Peggy MacKenzie presented gifts to all who had helped.

Community Quilts Chair Deb Mulcahy spoke as completed quilts where shown to the membership. She also asked members to give special thanks to Jan Walls for delivering the quilts for the last two years to 28 different agencies. Quilts were recently presented at the county's Adoption Day ceremony which included 22 babies being adopted. Lapreil Schwan was the winner of the drawing for those who had participated in the community quilts program during the last month.

The community Quilts challenge was explained, noting that instructions and bags were still available for those willing to participate.

ECHOS chair Marie Willison announced there will be no meetings in May or June due to other classes and the June luncheon. Nancy Hall will be joining her as co-chair in July.

Kristi McHugh announced a change in order of items for the day. The plan was to have the budget presentation and discussion, as well as show and tell, after the break and program with LeAnn Heilman.

Kristi announced the Nomination Committee's Slate of Officers for 2019-2020 as follows:

There were no other nominations so the members approved the slate after a First by Julie Dodds and a Second by Susan Perry.

Newly filled committee chair positions for the next year included:

Lori McCarthy as Mini-Group Coordinator

Kristi McHugh and Susan Perry as Quilt Show Co-Chairs.

Kristi & Susan announced that the theme for the show will be "2020 Visions of Quilts," to be held at the Findlay Toyota Center in Prescott Valley on June 5-6. They will also need a number of chairs to work with them, including publicity and registration. They noted that proposed budget includes funds to hire movers to help with the hanging equipment. Kristi announced that several committee chairs were still need for the next year:

1. Programs co-chair to work with Donna Domino

2. 2020 Opportunity Quilt Marketer which is a major fund-raiser for the guild.

2. Spring Camp chairpersons.

3. Someone to coordinate the Spring Luncheon in June

Kristi proposed an alternative way to do thread brigade in which able-bodied members would be assigned to each month, similar to how the refreshments are handled. After discussion it was determined to continue with the current plan to have members sign up. Everyone was encouraged to participate.

It was noted only five members had provided snacks for the meeting so everyone was asked to eat lightly to give everyone opportunity to eat something. Kitchen coordinator Dolores Schrock also needs several new helpers in the coming year.

Kristi reminded members that next month's meeting will be the TOAD (Treasured Objects Almost Done) program coordinated by Marcia McMullen.

Ronnie Sandoval and Susan Perry then reviewed upcoming programs. Sixteen have signed up for the class by LeAnn Hileman being offered that afternoon and following day. In July Patti Pearce will give a trunk show on vintage kitchen linens followed by a half-day workshop. Cost of the class is \$15 plus pattern and linens will be available for purchase. The July speaker is Janet Davis and she'll also teach a class the following day on paper piecing with freezer paper. The class fee is \$45.

Kristi called for the budget presentation by Treasurer Kathy Hofmiester. She pointed out income from dues was reduced by \$200 since membership had not reached 200 this past year. This is based on dues remaining \$30 per person for the year. She also noted an increase of \$1,300 to rent the event center for the quilt show. Thirdly, by changing insurance companies for officer liability insurance resulted a savings of \$500. Hildy Smith motioned the budget be accepted as presented with a second by Lucy Fields. Membership voted and approved the budget as proposed.

The meeting was then adjourned for break, followed by the program by LeAnn Hileman. Show and Tell concluded the day with the following members participating: Betty Foley, Janet Nieuwenhoff, Donna Domino, Vicki Smola, Kay Hoff, Marcia Jacobson, Sherri Hubbs, Joan Stanfield, Carole Lewis, Ruth Ann Clark, Patty McClearn, Maxine Everaert, Jan Walls, Cathy Vitrano and Kathleen Bond.


