MTQG Quilt Show June 5, 6 at the Findlay Event Center Susan Perry and Kristi McHugh

Quilt Show ribbons are made for viewer's choice awards and youth participants. Ribbons are usually made with an embroidered or fabric printed center, surrounded by fabric and some sort of hanging ribbons are added. There is lots of flexibility in the design and this should be fun for a few people to work on together.
