This month brings us Karen Miller of Red Bird Quilt Co. On Monday, October 16, her lecture is on Aurifilosophy followed by a ½ day workshop on Creative Chaos playing with different weight threads. Cost \$25, plus a kit fee of \$39.91. On Tuesday October 17, she will be presenting a full day workshop, Wren in Spring, on wool hand applique. Cost \$50, plus optional kit fee of \$25 (includes pattern). If not purchasing a kit, you must purchase the pattern at class \$5. A few limited spots left in each.

In November we have Gail Shannon presenting trunk show. Monday. а November 20, she will present a $\frac{1}{2}$ day workshop on how to select colors and take the fear out of choosing fabrics. MTQG Meeting Minutes for September 18, 2023

President Suzy Davidson thanked everyone for coming and asked everyone to mute cell phones.

August Minutes: Linda Marley motioned to approve, second by Barbara Stein, and approved.

Birthdays: Suzy Davidson read the list of September birthdays. She stated that we will not have a birthday drawing for a pattern any longer; something else for patterns will be announced soon.

Community Quilt Visual: Suzy Davidson referenced a cart containing community quilts bundles in desperate need of quilting. She noted between 200 to 300 quilt tops need backings sewn and about the same amount need quilting. Someone had suggested that a quilt bundle be put on each member's chair. However, she encouraged members to quilt smaller size quilts on their domestic machines. Today's ECHOS will address this situation.

ECHOS: Today Charlene Coxworth and Bobbie Turnbow will demonstrate how to sandwich the quilt top, batting and backing using spray adhesive. Members are encouraged to attend and learn this step to be able to quilt community quilts at home on their domestic machines.

Opportunity Quilt Marketing: Vicky Hall, chairperson, thanked all who had volunteered to sell tickets and reported \$595 income at the Yavapai County Fair with over \$1000 to date. The next events include the Cottonwood Quilt Show on October 20-21; Lonesome Valley Boutique October 27-28, and Rim Country Quilt Roundup in Payson on November 3-4 where we will help with white gloving and/or security and lastly, the Rusty Barn in Tucson on November 9-11. She asked for volunteers to go to Tucson and several volunteered. Shifts last for 1-1/2 hours. Signup sheets are available. Members are asked to purchase \$10 worth of tickets.

Programs: Cheri Heinecke, Program Chair, announced the programs:

- **Today**: Coco Alaniz, MTQG member, will present a trunk show. Tuesday will be a class making an All-purpose Apron with Deep Pockets. Cost: \$45 includes pattern.
- October 16-17: Karen Miller, Red Bird Quilts, (https://redbirdquiltco.com) Monday 10/16 lecture on Aurifilosophy followed by a ½-day workshop Creative Chaos playing with different weight threads. The cost is \$25, plus a kit fee of \$39.91.

Tuesday, 10/17, full day, Wren in Spring, Wool Hand Applique. \$50, plus optional kit fee of \$25 (includes pattern) paid directly to Karen. If not purchasing a kit, the pattern must be purchased at class for \$5.

• November 20-21: Gail Shannon, a trunk show, on Monday, 11/20, and ½ day workshop. The cost is \$40 on how to select colors and take the fear out of choosing fabrics. Book needed is: A Fiber Artist's Guide to Color & Design: The Basics and Beyond by Heather Thomas. Members will need to order the book online to have it in time for class. Tuesday, 11/21, the full day workshop, \$50. Teaches how to use Sew Kind of Wonderful, Quick Curve Rulers, Large (12"x7") and/or QCR Mini. Order rulers online if members don't already have them.

Membership/Guests: Donna Domino noted 7 guests signed in today: Susan George, Lisa Ancona, Sharla Peterson, Shelley Graham, Deena Knight, Nancy Adams, and Karen Coleman and several joined MTQG. New directories (100) were distributed today. If you did not receive one, she can send you an email copy or you can obtain a printed one next month.

New Member Group: John Ramsey noted meetings are held at the Granite Dells Clubhouse on the first Thursday of the month between 1 and 3 p.m.

Quilt Show Update: In Diana's absence, John Ramsey reported the first meeting was held Friday, September 15. The next meeting will be held Friday, October 13, at 9 a.m. at their home. He noted the contract with Findlay Toyota Center should be signed in November and the dates are confirmed as May 30 (setup) and the show on May 31 and June 1. Totes were available today for chairpersons.

Boutique for 2024 Quilt Show: Carol Cooley thanked members for submitting completed boutique items. She reviewed some of the available kits and encouraged members to make one item per month and to submit some of their own projects. Christmas and baby items have not sold in the past.

Fall Quilt Camp: Nancy Hall noted camp is full. Dates are October 10 – 13 at Chapel Rock in Prescott. If you would like to be put on a waiting list in case someone cancels, please see her. Costs are \$340 double occupancy, \$406 single and \$170 for commuter.

Block of the Month: Susan Szot reviewed this year's BOM program and showed two completed second month blocks. Instructions are on the website or can be emailed to participants. She suggested that members make two blocks in different colors each month – one to keep and one for a community quilt.

Community Quilts: Diane Stockhaus reported:

- 30 quilts were distributed this month for a total of 133 for the year.
- The next workshop will be Monday, September 25, here beginning at 9 a.m. There will be more "free to a good home" items.
- Oversize quilts are often donated to other agencies for their fundraisers such as Frontier Rotary.
- Granite Creek Health and Rehabilitation has requested wheelchair size Christmas quilts for their Christmas party. Kits will be distributed at next week's workshop.
- Nancy Hall delivers quilts to various agencies.
- Many quilt tops need quilting and then binding.
- Nancy Williams won the drawing.

Other: Suzy Davidson announced that:

- Sam Logan was in attendance after her recent heart surgery.
- Pam Easley is in rehab after hip replacement surgery.
- The Elks has set up a recycling program so remember to recycle appropriate items.
- Although MTQG is not a member of Arizona Quilt Guild (AQG), MTQG members can be individual members of AQG and participate in their March Quilt Show.
- More quilts were submitted to Yavapai County Fair this year. Some were hung backwards and MTQG has offered to help next year.
