Block of the Month

Happy August Quilters,

Have you decided on joining us on this Quilt of the Month journey? I have been so very encouraged by hearing from a number of you that you are doing one of the two projects. It is NOT too late to jump on board. This year I have two different projects from which to choose. He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not is the quilt that is made entirely of squares and rectangles with NO bias edges to contend with. Happy Hues is the more challenging quilt made up of lots of triangles. This vear. there is something for everyone.

Happy Hues has two separate sets of cutting instructions: one set for those using scissors and/or rotary cutters to prepare your elements; one set for those using the AccuQuilt system to cut your pieces.

Extra Special, Read All About It: Your Guild has purchased the AccuQuilt 8 Inch Block cube which includes the cutting dies for the various size triangles needed in this quilt. Once you are trained on the use of this resource, you can save yourself hours of cutting to prepare pieces that fit together perfectly.



Happy Hues starts with a fairly involved medallion at its center for Block 1, which we began last month. "Block 2" is actually 4 borders, only one of which is pieced, so you can easily get started now and catch up. Spoiler Alert: "Block 3" is also just three strip borders, none of which is pieced. One caution, in several of the patterns for the monthly block, the directions call for 1/4 inch seams. Do not believe it! All of the blocks need "scant 1/4 inch seams" and if you use the full 1/4 inch, you will be ripping out to redo so the blocks will fit. Get the pattern for Blocks 1 and 2 here:

He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not is simple and fun to put together. It is a great one to showcase your favorite fabrics because the first four blocks use the exact same pattern and have a center block that is 9 inches square. The pattern calls for making one of these blocks each month for the first four months, using two different focus fabrics and making two identical blocks with each. Talk about easy to start late and catch up quickly! I personally have decided not to duplicate any blocks, so I have used or will use different focus fabrics for each.
