Block of the Month

As I write this we are still experiencing above normal temperatures for this time of year, but September is the gateway to the beautiful Autumn that we enjoy in central Arizona. Don't we all look forward to cooler temperatures, beautiful Fall colors, and pumpkin-spice EVERYTHING.

I hope you are enjoying this year's BOM as much as I am. Once again, if you have not yet started, it will be easy to catch up, regardless of which pattern you choose to make.

We are in "block 3" for each pattern. If you are piecing blocks for "He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not", Block 3 is the same as Blocks 1,2 and 4. The pattern calls for 1 and 2 in one colorway and 3 and 4 in a different colorway. I have chosen to make each of these a different colorway.

If you are piecing "Happy Hues", Block 3 is three whole cloth borders and 1 block. If you are using the Accuquilt dies to cut your fabric, use the first link. If you are cutting by hand, use the second link. If you are piecing "He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not", use the third link.

Block of the Month – Susan Szot Susan Szot showed the "easy" block sample, block # 2 called He Loves me Loves me Not. The more difficult one with lots of points block called Happy Ques, block 2 was the 4 borders that go around the center block. Make sure use "scant" quarter inch seam on the whole block.

New Banners for MTQG and Opportunity Quilt table: Bobbie Mae asked the members to be thinking about new refreshed design for our banners. Keep working on new designs and have fun with it. Bring ideas for new design to Sept meeting for vote. Mountain Top is 2 words on the banners.

Community Quilts - Suzy Davidson and Vicky Hall Vicky Hall showed the number of tubs that need various different things done for quilts such as needs batting, needs back pieced, need backs, etc. Vicky also read a couple thank you cards the guild received from Mary's Hospice and Good Samaritan Hospital. (amended 08/21/24 should have been Good Samaritan Hospice Team)

Suzy advised we have some new agencies this year to donate quilts to; Prescott PD / Yavapai SO need 150, Chino Valley Police and Prescott Valley Police need 10 each, Hospice and Vets. Law enforcement use the quilts to give comfort to child abuse, sex assault etc. victims. Suzy advised we are in need of some more adult masculine quilts.

- No Community Quilts this month. Elks Club is closed for fire inspection.
- 59 quilts taking in today completed.
- There is a backlog of quilt tops needing quilting. To promote completing quilts, the first five quilts are donated free and for any multiple of 5 after we will reimburse you \$20 for supplies, machine wear etc. Community Quilts will keep track for you. The money to fund this is raised by the sale of fabric etc.
- Opportunities to get quilt bundles every Tuesday 3:30-5:30pm, at the General meetings once a month, and Opportunity quilt day which is usually 4th Monday of the month.
