Fall Quilt Camp will be Tuesday, October 10 - Friday, October 13, 2023 at Chapel Rock in Prescott. Sign ups will take place at 8:30 am on Monday, August 21, prior to the start of the August Guild meeting. There is room for 18 campers. A waiting list will be started in case anyone has to cancel. In order to secure your reservation, you must turn in the registration form and either deposit \$170 or full payment, at the time of sign up. This is nonrefundable, unless there is someone on the waiting list who can fill your vacancy. The registration form is available on the MTQG website under Forms Prices include hotel-style accommodations (except for day campers), 9 meals, snacks, all the sewing time you can handle, and quilting with friends. Bring your own projects to work on.

- \$340 per person double occupancy
- \$406 for a single room
- \$170 for day campers, no overnight

If you cannot sign up in person, please have a friend turn in your registration form and payment on August 21. No mail-in registrations will be accepted.

Sue Szot, the new chair for Block of the Month, invites you to participate in this year's Block of the Month. We will be working proiect featured on а on AllPeopleQuilt.com as the BOM for May, 2014. I have been unable to obtain its name. Requests to its designer, Monique Dillard of Open Gate Quilts, have remained unanswered, but I believe this will be a fun project. This quilt has eight 9" blocks and each block is surrounded by setting triangles. The quilt is shown in a planned color pallet, but could easily be made scrappy, using up your stash. The finished size of this quilt is 55 1/2 inches by 73 1/2 inches.

Please consider making each quilt block twice, in the same or a completely different colorway. At year's end, you will have two beautiful quilts, one to keep or give to a loved one, and one to donate to our Community Quilts Project.

Because we live in a digital age, copies of the block will not be made available on paper. To get directions, please sign up to receive the monthly block instructions via email. We'll, it's that time again...the MTQG Quilt Show Community Quilts Challenge! This biennial tradition allows Guild members to show off their creativity with a display at the 2024 Quilt Show, following some basic rules for the challenge. This year, each participant will receive three yards of coordinated fabric from the Guild stash, with instructions for quilt assembly. Prior to the 2024 Show, Guild members will vote on their favorite submission, and prizes will be

awarded to the top three vote getters. Then, all submissions will be displayed in a separate section of the Show, along with information for the public to better understand our charitable activities. After the Show, all submissions will be donated to one of the charities we usually support.

Participant kits will be available to pick up from the Community Quilts table during the August general meeting **during the break.** There will be 30 kits, so make sure you get yours...No kits will be distributed before the break. Detailed instructions will be verbalized during the August meeting.

As was discussed at the July meeting, excess Community Quilts fabric will be available for sale to guild members only, starting at **8:45** at the August meeting. Price will be based on \$1/yard, so if the available boxes have half yards, each would be 50 cents, fat quarters would be 25 cents, etc. Future meetings will include 2.5" strips at 10 for \$1! The fabric sales will end when the regular meeting starts at 9:30. Come take a look!

Our monthly workshop will occur on **Monday, August 28th, at 9:00 am**, at the Elks Lodge. Join in the fun of helping our Community Quilts efforts.

MTQG Meeting Minutes for July 17, 2023

President Suzy Davidson thanked everyone for coming and asked everyone to mute cell phones.

Special Announcement: The Bernina 570 sewing machine that had been stolen from Quilt and Sew last month was returned; someone left it outside the store.

June Minutes: Barbara Stein motioned to approve, second by Michele Schneider, and were approved.

Birthdays: Suzy Davidson read the list of July birthdays. Linda Marley won the drawing.

Job Descriptions: The Board has prepared updated job descriptions (shorter ones for the directory and more detailed for the various committee chairpersons). Rhoda Chapman will be sending these to the chair persons for their review. These should be returned to Rhoda with any comments or suggested changes.

President's 2024 Challenge: Suzy Davidson announced a Quilt Show Challenge based on the theme "*Every Quilt is a Memory*." Make a quilt that shows one of your favorite memories. Quilts will be due April 24, 2024 can be any size, and there are no other rules. Quilts will be grouped together at the 2024 Quilt Show.

Opportunity Quilt Marketing: A chairperson is still needed for this job. Peggy MacKenzie is selling tickets today -- \$5.00 for 6 tickets. It is suggested that each member purchase \$10 of tickets. Please submit suggestions for places to sell tickets and a name for the quilt to Suzy Davidson. Quilt Show entries will be due in March and challenge quilts will not be counted in the number of quilts members can submit.

Newsletter Update: Theresa Barnard, newsletter chairperson, noted this month's issue had been late; she had been out of state. Let Theresa know if you did not get the reminder email. She would like to change the newsletter and add other articles. Future issues will be included on the website and will be sent by email.

Programs: Cheri Heinecke, Program Chair for 2023-2024, announced the programs:

- **Today**: Heidi Pridemore with a presentation and a Tuesday class on Chain Reaction.
- August: Member Janet Nieuwenhoff with a trunk show followed by an ECHOS class on the Accuquilt Cutter by John Ramsey.

- September: Member Coco Alaniz with a Monday presentation followed by an ECHOS about using rotary cutters and a Tuesday class on aprons. Sign-ups begin in July.
- October: Karen Miller from Red Bird Quilt Company talking about wool with a Tuesday class.

ECHOS: John Ramsey will present how to use the Accuquilt Cutter after Janet Nieuwenhoff's presentation in August.

Membership/Guests: Donna Domino introduced 8 guests: Susan George, Tess Wheeler, Marcia Ford, Lorraine Owen, Danette Tice, Billie Gipe, Evelyn Serrato, and Cynthia Welsh. She reminded members this year's \$30 dues need to be paid by the end of this meeting for information to be included in the 2023-2024 Directory. She also noted that members are entitled to two half-price classes again this year.

New Members Group: Lori McCarthy and John Ramsey noted the first meeting will be **August 3 from 1 to 3 pm** at the Granite Dells Clubhouse. Notice will be on the website and in Grapevine messages but not by email. The topic will be what goes on at the guild and what is on our website.

Block of the Month: Susan Szot is on vacation and this year's 8-month BOM program will begin next month. It is suggested that members consider making two blocks in different colors each month – one to keep and one for a community quilt.

Quilt Show 2024: Diana Ramsey noted the first meeting will be held **September 15 at 9:30 am** at her home.

Boutique for 2024 Quilt Show: Jean Dunk noted that kits are available and encouraged members to pick up kits to make at home. If every member makes one item per month, there will be about 2400 items for the boutique. Things that have not sold in the past include Christmas and baby items. Try to use newer fabrics and bright colors.

Youth Quilting: Diana Ramsey announced the Youth Quilting program begins here on **August 15**. Nine students meet on Tuesdays from 3:30 to 5:30. Volunteers to assist students should report at 3:00.

Fall Quilt Camp: Janice Zolnierowicz noted camp will be **October 10-13** at Chapel Rock in Prescott with space for 18 campers. You may work on your own projects or community quilts. Signups will be **August 21** at 8:45 a.m. Registration forms are online; no mail-in forms will be accepted. There will be a waiting list. A non-refundable deposit is due with registration. Costs are \$340 double occupancy, \$406 single and \$170 for commuter.

Community Quilts: Diane Stockhaus reported:

- 62 quilts were distributed this month.
- The next workshop will be **Monday**, **July 24**, here beginning at 9 a.m.
- She will introduce a new challenge next month in addition to the Quilt Show Challenge.
- In August excess fabric will again be for sale.
- Christina Tisdale won the drawing.

Refreshments: The schedule for bringing finger foods is alphabetical and will be included in the directory, the newsletter and on the website.

Meals-on-Wheels Placemats: Michele Schneider announced the continuation of last year's placemat program. Placemats should be about standard size of 13" x 18", should not be religious or political but can be red, white, and blue, should have the Mountain Top label sewn on and will be due in early December. Last year 180 placemats were made, and more are needed.

Other: Suzy Davidson announced that:

- Members wearing crocheted flowers can answer your questions.
- Members who need to set up should arrive by 8:30; doors will open for the general membership at 8:45 a.m.
