September 18-19: Member Coco Alanez, will be presenting a Trunk show on Monday September 18. Tuesday, September 19,

workshop will present a large pocket apron. Cost \$45, which includes a pattern. Contact Coco if you are interested in purchasing a kit.

September ECHOS: Members, Charlene Coxworth and Bobbie Turnbow, will be providing tips and tricks for sandwiching quilts.

October 16-17: Karen Miller of Red Bird Quilt Co. (https://redbirdquiltco.com) will be our guest on Monday, October 16, and will feature a lecture on Aurifilosophy. Immediately following will be a half day workshop on playing with different weight threads titled Creative Chaos. Cost is \$25, plus a kit fee of \$39.91.

Tuesday, October 17, will be a full day workshop on wool hand applique titled Wren in Spring. Cost is \$50, plus optional kit fee of \$25 (includes pattern). If you are not purchasing a kit, you must purchase the pattern at class for \$5. Only a few spots are left in each class.

November 20-21: Gail Shannon will be presenting a trunk show on Monday, November 20. Immediately following the meeting will be a half day workshop on how to select colors and take the fear out of choosing fabrics. Cost is \$40. Book needed is: <u>A Fiber Artist's Guide to Color & Design:</u> <u>The Basics and Beyond</u> by Heather Thomas. You will need to order the book online, so you have it for class.

Tuesday, November 21, will be a full day workshop with instruction on how to use Sew Kind of Wonderful's Quick Curve Rulers. Workshop is \$50. You will need either the large (12"x7") and/or QCR Mini rulers. Order your rulers online if you don't already have them.

<u> Tips 'n Tricks</u>

Have you heard of Charlotte's Fusible Web? This caught my eye and as I like to do both machine and hand applique, I thought I would order a spool and give it a try. This is primarily used for raw edge applique. I'm actually quite impressed. The thread is a nylon thread and is intended to be used only in the bobbin. Top thread should be something smooth like a polyester or mono-poly. Here are the steps in using this thread:

- Trace your applique piece onto your fabric using a heat removable marker. Do not cut out.
- With Fusible Web in your bobbin and polyester (or other) thread on top, sew as close to your marked line as possible. Do not cut your tail threads short.
- Cut out your applique piece as close to the sewn line as possible without cutting through the thread.
- Place your applique piece with Fusible Web thread against your backing fabric, leaving the top tail hanging outside of applique.
- With a warm iron (cotton setting), press for about 10 seconds until the applique is fused.
- While the applique is still warm, pull the top thread out. Make sure to do this while the fabric is warm, otherwise your fabric can fray.
- Your applique is fused to the backing fabric, with no added stiffness or bulk.

- Stitch around your applique with decorative stitching.
- If you'd like, you can cut out the backing to leave only one layer of fabric.
- If you are working with multiple layers of applique, start with the bottom piece first and work to the top.

If you've used this thread, let me know how you like it.

MTQG Meeting Minutes for August 21, 2023

President Suzy Davidson thanked everyone for coming and asked everyone to mute cell phones.

July Minutes: Diana Ramsey motioned to approve, second by Bobbie Turnbow, and approved.

Birthdays: Suzy Davidson read the list of August birthdays. Mary Terry won the drawing.

President's 2024 Challenge: Suzy Davidson reminded members of the Quilt Show Challenge based on the theme "*Every Quilt is a Memory*." Make a quilt of any size that shows one of your favorite memories. Quilts will be grouped together at the 2024 Quilt Show.

Opportunity Quilt Marketing: Vicky Hall, Chairperson, asked for volunteers to sell tickets at two events: Quilt Craft and Sew Festival (formerly The Rusty Barn) held in Scottsdale over Labor Day Weekend and the Yavapai County Fair held September 7 – 10. Our place to sell tickets is in the air conditioned Mackin Building. Shifts last for 1-1/2 hours. Signup sheets were available.

Programs: Cheri Heinecke, Program Chair for 2023-2024, announced the programs:

- **September:** Coco Alaniz, MTQG member, a Monday lecture and trunk show. Tuesday class making an All-purpose Apron with Deep Pockets. Cost: \$45 includes pattern. The supply list will be on our website.
- **October:** Karen Miller, Red Bird Quilts, Monday trunk show followed by a half-day workshop on different thread weights called Creative Chaos, cost \$25. Tuesday will be a full day Wool Hand Applique class called Spring Wren. The cost is \$50 plus an optional \$25 kit fee paid directly to Karen.
- **November** will be Gail Shannon with a lecture on Color and Composition. A half-day workshop on Monday requires the book *Color and Design* by Heather Thomas. There will be a full day workshop on Tuesday using either of the large or mini curved "Some Kind of Wonderful Ruler."

ECHOS: John Ramsey will present how to use the Accuquilt Cutter after Janet Nieuwenhoff's presentation today. An inventory of cutter supplies is on our website.

Membership/Guests: Donna Domino noted there were 13 guests today – too many to introduce individually. Pages from the new directory are being circulated for proof. New directories will be distributed next month.

Mini Groups: Liz Hart noted there are 12 friendship groups. She will attend a New Member Group with more information and today circulated a form listing current Mini Groups with space to submit suggestions for additional groups.

New Member Group: Lori McCarthy and John Ramsey noted the first meeting was held at the Granite Dells Clubhouse. Next month's meeting will be **September 7** at the same location from 1 to 3 p.m. and the topic will be your favorite tool.

Block of the Month: Susan Szot talked about this year's BOM program from All People's Quilts. The finished size is 55-1/2 by 73-1/2. Instructions will be on the website or can be emailed to participants. She suggested that members consider making two blocks in different colors each month – one to keep and one for a community quilt.

Boutique for 2024 Quilt Show: Carol Cooley noted that kits are available and encouraged members to pick up kits to make one item per month at home. Things that have not sold in the past include Christmas and baby items.

Fall Quilt Camp: Nancy Hall noted 17 campers signed up this morning leaving one open spot. Dates are **October 10 - 13**. If needed, there will be a waiting list. Costs are \$340 double occupancy, \$406 single and \$170 for commuters.

Community Quilts: Diane Stockhaus reported:

- 42 quilts were distributed this month for a total of 103 for the year.
- The next workshop will be **Monday, August 28**, here beginning at 9 a.m.
- She introduced a new challenge for the Quilt Show. Thirty kits are available; each contains three yards of coordinated fabrics. She showed an Arizona Block. A challenge rule is that one Arizona Block must be on the front of the quilt. Each must have a Mountain Top label on the back. Viewer's Choice will be selected in May with the top 3 quilts receiving a prize.
- Nancy Hall delivers quilts to a number of agencies, such as CASA, AZ Crisis Team, U.S. Vets and the VA, Project Linus, and various hospice agencies. She asked for additional suggestions.
- Donations will be accepted and, if Mt. Top cannot use it, the donation will be forwarded to an agency who can.
- Many quilt tops need quilting and then binding.
- In October excess fabric will again be for sale.
- Sue Ely won the drawing.

Refreshments: The schedule for bringing finger foods is alphabetical and will be included in the directory, the newsletter and on the website. If you cannot attend when

you are scheduled to bring refreshments, please arrange for a sub, or notify Linda Snavely.

Other: Suzy Davidson announced that:

- Completed Meals-on-Wheels placemats can be turned in today.
- John Ramsey noted the Elks is collecting small teddy bears to be given to children by law enforcement agencies when the children have had a traumatic experience.
