October Minutes: Sherri Hubbs motioned to approve, second by Jan Walls, and approved.

Birthdays: Suzy Davidson read the list of November birthdays.

Welcome Sedona Red Rock Quilters Guild with their Opportunity Quilt: Tickets are on sale today for their Opportunity Quilt. Their quilt show runs from January 8 through March 2, 2024, at the Sedona Public Library.

Sunshine: Marcia McMullen has had a double mastectomy and is recovering at home. Judy Sloan broke her arm. Adrianne Morrison suffered a light stroke last month and is recovering nicely. Cards and emails would be appreciated.

Opportunity Quilt Marketing: Vicky Hall, chairperson, noted \$210 of tickets were sold at the Rim Country Quilt Roundup Show. Two sign-up sheets are available for ticket sales: one for the Chino Valley Show this weekend Friday and Saturday; the second for the Stocking Stuffer event on December 16. Lake Havasu has agreed to let us sell tickets at their February show or a Wednesday night meeting from 6 to 8 pm. More information will follow.

- Jeanne Dunk is in charge of publicity including bookmarks.

Boutique for 2024 Quilt Show: Carol Cooley noted the committee would like every member to donate 12 items to the boutique, especially items with a quilting theme. ECHOS will be held in December to show how to make the Friendship Star coaster and in January the snap bags. Quilts will be sold at the boutique. Other items include luggage tags, hot pads, zippered pouches, pin cushions, snap bags, bowl cozy, and flash drive holder. Some supplies are available along with instructions or links to tutorials. She showed a vest and jacket donated by Janice Zolnierowicz.

Block of the Month: Susan Szot showed two completed blocks for this month. Instructions are on the website or can be emailed to participants. No blocks will be done in December and the quilt top will be completed January through April. Community Quilts: Diane Stockhaus reported:
