In addition to Heidi Pridemore, July brings us a brand new challenge. The challenge is for beginners to professionals. More details and a signup at the July meeting.

For our **Monday, August 21** meeting, our very own member, Janet Nieuwenhoff, will be presenting a Trunk Show. Janet has won awards for her quilts, including Best of Show. Fall Quilt Camp will be Tuesday, October 10 - Friday, October 13, 2023 at Chapel Rock in Prescott. Sign ups will take place at 8:30 am on Monday, August 21, prior to the start of the August Guild meeting. There is room for 18 campers. A waiting list will be started in case anyone has to cancel. In order to secure your reservation, you must turn in the registration form and either deposit \$170 or full payment, at the time of sign up. This is nonrefundable, unless there is someone on the waiting list who can fill your vacancy. The registration form is available on the MTQG website under Forms. Prices include hotel-style accommodations (except for day campers), 9 meals, snacks, all the sewing time you can handle, and quilting with friends. Bring your own projects to work on.

- \$406 for a single room
- \$170 for day campers, no overnight

If you cannot sign up in person, please have a friend turn in your registration form and payment on August 21. No mail-in registrations will be accepted.

May Minutes: Bobbie Mae Ball motioned to approve, Diana Ramsey seconded, and minutes were approved.

Birthdays: John read the list of June birthdays. Pam Verberg won the drawing.

Presentation of gifts from outgoing President: John Ramsey asked the 27 chairpersons and committee members to come forward. He noted it takes all these people to make Mountain Top Quilt Guild run smoothly. He gave each person a gift to thank them. Then he thanked and gave gifts to each of the board members. Suzy Davidson and board members presented John with his President's quilt made from blocks submitted by guild members and quilted by Kathy Hofmeister.

Refreshments: Linda Snavely will continue as chair of this activity. The schedule for bringing refreshments will be included in the directory, the newsletter and on the website. Coffee and water will be provided.

Quail Country Quilters from Cottonwood were present with their two opportunity quilts – one a queen size and the second a smaller reversible quilt made from leftover fabrics. Their quilt show is October 20 and 21, 2023 at the Verde Valley Fairgrounds in Cottonwood. Two tickets will be drawn and the first will receive the queen size and the second the smaller one.

Programs: Erin Sullivan introduced Cheri Heinecke who will be Program Chair for 2023-2024. Erin also reviewed programs for the remainder of the year.

New Members Group: Lori McCarthy and John Ramsey will lead this program with meetings beginning in August and held at the Clubhouse where Lori lives or at fabric stores.

Fall Quilt Camp: Janice Zolnierowicz noted camp will be October 10-13, 2023 at Chapel Rock in Prescott with space for 18 campers. You may work on your own projects or community quilts. Signups will be August 21 at 8:30 a.m. Registration forms are online. No mail-in forms will be accepted. There will be a waiting list. A non-refundable deposit is due with registration. Costs are \$340 double occupancy, \$406 single and \$170 for commuters. There was a short discussion of refunds for non-attendance and the board will discuss this at their next meeting.

Boutique: Carol Cooley noted the committee will meet after today's luncheon. She suggested a project each month.

Community Quilts: Diane Stockhaus reported:
