## Community Quilts

Our next workshop will be held on Monday, November 27, starting at 9:00 am, at the Elks Lodge in Prescott Valley. This will be our last workshop in 2023, so plan to join in the fun. We will be piecing quilt backs, cutting batting for bundles, and have our 'Free to a Good Home' table.

We will be selling excess guild fabric again at the November regular meeting. Available pieces will be quarter-yards, fat quarters, and homespun. This will be our last sale of the year, so as not to interfere with the guild Holiday Party in December. Starting in January, we will have 'grab bags' for sale. Each bag will contain one pound of miscellaneous fabric of assorted colors and sizes. Each bag will cost \$1, and sold 'as is', that means no swapping of fabric between bags before you buy. What's in the bag is what you buy...but you can swap with your friends to your hearts delight! Again, this will begin in January.

For those of you participating in the current Community Quilts Arizona Block Challenge, please don't forget to get your

project going, if you haven't started already. The rules are simple...at least one Arizona Block (pattern included in each package) must be included on your quilt top. If you need backing or batting for your guilt, please come to the monthly workshop for selection availability. Also, if you need help quilting your project, please contact Diane Stockhaus so she can provide you with the names of guild members who have volunteered their time, resources and talents to help with this task. Remember, each guilt must be turned in ready for distribution...which means guilted, bound, and with a guild label affixed to the back of your quilt.

And speaking of labels, I'd like to remind those of you finishing quilts for our monthly donation efforts to attach a guild label to the back of your quilt(s). Labels are always available at the Community Quilts table during our monthly meetings.
