Block of the Month

We are making good progress on our quilts and in the month of October we will be working on month four.

If you are constructing "He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not", the quilt pattern without bias edges, you will be making the fourth and last rendition of the first block in the

pattern. The designer called for two sets of two identical blocks. I have chosen a scrappy color scheme so each of my first four blocks are made of different fabrics. This is your quilt, so you do what pleases you. By the way, if you are reading this and have not joined in, yet, this is an easy one to catch up on. To download the pattern, go to: https://bomquilts.com/ and scroll down to "He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not".

If you are creating "Happy Hues", in month four you will be piecing the blue blocks. Of course, depending on the color scheme you have chosen, your blocks may not be blue, but as the pattern is depicted, this month we are creating the blue ones. There are eight of these blocks in the quilt, so this month you will need to spend a bit more time than you have had to up to this point.

Remember, your Quilt Guild has both an electric and manual Accuquilt Go Cutter and all the dies needed for cutting out the elements needed for this quilt, and they are free to check out. Contact John Ramsey if you would like to use this system for accurate cutting. It is a wonderful tool and far faster than cutting the shapes by hand.

Approval of August General meeting minutes: Judy Brungardt advised of changes to the August General meeting minutes as followed: Vicky Hall advised Good Samaritan Hospital be amended to Good Samaritan Hospice Team, Lucy Fields advised Mary's Hospice be amended to Maggie's Hospice, and Suzy Davidson advised to amend "To promote getting quilting completed on quilts, the first 10 quilts that you quilt are done for free and then for any multiple of 10 that you quilt and turn in, we will reimburse you \$20 for quilting for supplies, machine wear, etc."

Sharon Harris made motion to amend minutes, Mary Jane Godwin seconded motion, minutes amended as read.

General information: Free hand quilting frame, talk to Elizabeth Phinder. Frame was given away.

Carol Miller advised their mini group, Wearable Art has openings.

Email blasts must be approved by Bobbie Mae to send out.

Birthdays/Sunshine if any: Bobbie Mae read the list of August birthdays and asked members to briefly pop up and stand when their name was read.
