

Curves Again? Supply List – Paper Pieced Curves by Ann L. Petersen



38" x 38" Finished Quilt, 8" Finished Block

The sample is made from 5 purple and 7 green fat quarters plus ½ yd. of fabric for the border and ½ yd. of fabric for binding. You may use more or less fabrics, but the yardage should remain about the same. The largest pieces are cut from fabric at least 9" square.

Backing: 1 ¼ yard

Batting: 44" x 44"

Rotary cutter -28 mm is ideal; 45 mm will also work. I do not recommend the 60mm blade for this cutting. A new sharp blade is ideal.

Rotary matt – a matt that is 9" sq. or bigger is wonderful – not too big however, being able to turn the matt to cut is an advantage.

Rotary ruler for cutting binding strips

Add-a-Quarter ruler – small – Optional

Wooden iron or bone folder or another tool for crisply folding paper -Optional

Scissors for use on freezer paper, optional

Fine, sharp pins; I like glass-head silk pins

Fine thread – my two favorite brands are Superior Masterpiece and Aurifil 50 wt/2 ply on the orange spools

A good ¼" piecing foot for your machine, or a mark on your machine bed to give you a ¼" seam allowance

Sewing Machine in good working order

Sharp tool to help control fabric as you sew – I use curved, tweezer-like thread snips; other options would be a stiletto, a seam ripper, a wooden barbecue skewer, or a large straight pin.

Iron

Pressing matt or ironing board
