From light fabric cut:


three 2 1/2" x 15 1/2" fabric strips

four triangles using 1 layer of fabric and template 1 printed side up

From medium fabric cut three 2 1/2" x 15 1/2" fabric strips

From dark fabric cut four triangles using 1 layer of fabric and template 1 printed side down

- 1. With RST sew 1 medium fabric strip to each long side of 1 light fabric strip **using generous** 1/4" seams. Press seams toward the medium fabric.
- 2. Using template 2 with the printed side up and striped fabric strip made in step 1 right side up cut 4 triangles as follows. Align the bottom and top of the template with the top and bottom edges of the strip and the intermediate lines on the template should line up with the seam lines between the stripes. Cut one triangle, then turn template 180 degrees and cut the second triangle. Repeat once more to get a total of 4 striped triangles.
- 3. Place with RST the medium length side of one light fabric triangle on top of the long edge of the longest stripe of a triangle from step 2 and sew. Press seam toward the medium colored fabric. Repeat 3 more times. Label these pieces as A triangles.
- 4. With RST sew 1 light fabric strip to each side of the remaining medium fabric strip **using a generous 1/4" seam.** Press seams toward the medium fabric.
- 5. Using template 2 with the printed side of the template down and the striped fabric strip made in step 4 right side up cut 4 triangles as follows. Align the bottom and top of the template with the edges of the strip and the intermediate lines on the template should line up with the seam lines between the stripes. Cut one triangle, then turn template 180 degrees and cut the second triangle. Repeat once more to get a total of 4 triangles.
- 6. Place with RST the medium length side of one dark fabric triangle on top of the long edge of the longest stripe of a triangle from step 5 and sew. Press seam toward the dark fabric. Repeat 3 more times. Label these triangles as B triangles.
- 7. Using the block diagram as a placement guide sew with RST an A triangle to a B triangle. Press seam open. Repeat 3 more times. This creates four 1/4 block units.
- 8. Using the block diagram as a reference sew the 1/4 block units together.
