Please remember that all quilts will need a sleeve attached to the top and should be made according to the instructions on our website. Please do not use pins to attach the sleeve to the quilt - it must be sewn on. We will pin up the bottom of any quilts that are longer than our poles allow so that no quilts are touching the floor. Also, you may include a skirt hanger with clips for those special art quilts that have a lot of delicate attachments. This will help us when we are handling the quilt.

As with every quilt show, we need as many hands as possible to help hang the quilts. Pizza and water will be provided on Thursday, May 31st to all helpers. You can work just a few hours or stay all day, if you like. If you have a ladder or step-stool we can use, that would be greatly appreciated. Please put your name on the ladder/stool so we can make sure it gets back to you after the show. Hanging will begin at 10:00 am after we have had time to gather all the quilts and place them in their appropriate spots on the floor.

The quilts will be removed at 4:30 on Saturday, June 2nd. Do not expect to receive your quilt before that time.


Quilt Show Welcome Vignette

It was unfortunate that the quilts that were to be on loan for the show from the National Museum had to be canceled due to an insurmountable problem with insuring the quilts. Instead the show will feature a display of quilts from local quilters who have earned national awards: Carol Hood, Dorothy Philblad, Margot McDonnell, and Ann Novak.

They have invited the four local mayors to participate in the show; each will be awarding a ribbon for their favorite quilt.

Angie Christy would like help putting together award ribbons this Thursday. A Grapevine message went out with details.

Approximately 200 quilt entry forms have been received. They would like more, up to 300.

Additional "do not touch" mini-quilts came in today.

The quilt show volunteer sign-up sheets are available today. Please sign up for the over 500 hours of volunteering needed for the various aspects of the show: boutique, opportunity quilt, white glove, quilts with a story, small quilt auction, and set-up and takedown. The volunteer sheets will be available today and at next month's guild meeting (May).

Quilts with a Story - Kay Harlan: There are still openings for quilts with a story. Four volunteers are needed at each turning, with three events on Friday, and one on Saturday. Kay has a sample book with information. Those lending quilts will bring them on Thursday before the show.

Small Quilt Auction - Susan Perry and Kathy Barrett: They have 40 quilts donated to date, and would like as many as 60. They can be donated anytime up to next month's guild meeting.
