MTQG MEETING MINUTES

Monday, August 20, 2018

Treasurer Kathy Hofmeister, as temporary acting president, opened the meeting with an announcement concerning the Board's decision to deny membership to a former guild member. This decision to adhere to the MTQG Code of Conduct was made after long and careful deliberation. Kathy also announced the recent resignations, for personal reasons, of president Diane Stockhaus, president-elect Lori McCarthy, and secretary Susan Masse, all of whom were scheduled to serve during the 2018-19 fiscal year.

Per the guild's bylaws, Kathy Hofmeister, as acting president, along with board members Susan Perry and Ronnie Sandoval, asked for motion to nominate Kristi McHugh, who has agreed to serve if elected, for a vote to approve her as new guild president. Kay Denny moved and Marcia McMullen seconded. A vote was taken by show of hands, and approved. Kathy Hofmeister turned the meeting over to Kristi McHugh, as 2018-19 guild president. Kristi thanked the guild for the opportunity to serve.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Visitors/Hospitality - Kristi McHugh for Gail Henry (absent) - There were six visitors: Georgia Lance, Judy Lundquist, Cheryl Kempton, Kathy Vinson, Ronda Hatfield, and Shirley Guthrie. Kristi announced, for benefit of visitors and recent members, the purpose of the crocheted flowers worn by members who are willing to serve as sources of information.

Sunshine - Susan Masse for Vicki Smola (absent) - Those with August birthdays were asked to stand and be recognized, and a report about a member who recently had surgery was given.

Treasurer's Report - Kathy Hofmeister - Hildy Smith recently did an overview of the financial records and found them balanced. Kathy gave a summary of the Treasurer's Report, which is posted in the lobby.

Approval of August Minutes - Kristi McHugh - Bobbie Turnbow moved, and Hildy Smith seconded. Minutes approved.

ANNOUNCEMENTS - Kristi McHugh - Thank you notes were received from United Animal Friends and Stepping Stones for donated fund-raising quilts.

An inquiry was received regarding the feasibility of the guild assisting in a temporary display of a World Trade Center memorial quilt in Prescott or Prescott Valley. The quilt custodians are planning on taking the quilt on tour to various cities. The logistics of manpower, security, insurance, and venue cost were discussed and the guild decided to refer the display to Sharlot Hall Museum, or Embry Riddle, etc.

In order to give speakers a full hour, members are asked to return after the break by 10:55 at each meeting. In addition, routine committee chair reports may be handled in announcements, but will be put on the agenda if necessary.

Need volunteers for the President-Elect and Secretary positions. Anyone interested in more information or volunteering is asked to contact Kristi.

John Ramsey has agreed to be the Library Coordinator, along with a team of four additional volunteers.

Vicki Smola has volunteered to coordinate the Holiday Party in December.

Kristi asked membership if they wanted the guild Facebook page to continue to be maintained and updated. Most members indicated they would like Facebook to be continued.

Members were asked to bring in patterns to the August meeting for consideration for the 2020 Opportunity Quilt.

A sign-up sheet was passed around by John Ramsey for volunteers to help with the Youth Quilting group during the next session.

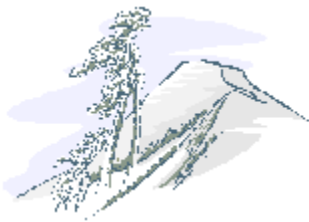
