What's happening with Programs:

February 19, 2024, Patsy Kittredge will present a Trunk Show and lecture. After the meeting she will do a free demo for us called, "Playing with Watercolors." It is FREE but you will need to sign-up at the programs table. There is a supply list for those that want to stay after her demo and continue playing with what Patsy just taught us. March 18, 2024, a workshop called Beginner Free Motion Quilting on vour domestic machine from 1:00-4:00, set-up at 12:40, \$20 cost, no kit fee. Tuesday, March 19, the workshop is "Curves Again", Paper Pieced Curves, 9:00-4:00, set-up at 8:40, \$30, no kit fee. Supply lists will be on the website in January. Sign-ups will start at the January 15th meeting.

April 15, 2024, Cynthia England, will Picture present Piecina (cynenglanddesign.com), a trunk show of unique picture piecing her method. Following the meeting will be a workshop, Roadrunner Landscape, 1:00-4:00, set-up at 12:40, \$30, kit fee \$43 Kit includes everything you need for the top including pattern and binding. Tuesday April 16 there workshop will be а called Small Landscapes. There are 2 choices - Old Grist Mill or Southwest Splendor. The class is 9:00-4:00, set-up at 8:40, \$38 plus a kit fee of \$58. This kit includes everything you need to make the top of the guilt including the binding. The first half of the class will focus on making the small 15" x 18" landscape quilt. The second half of the day will focus on turning your own photos into a picture piecing pattern. All supplies for this are included in the kit. Signups begin at the January 15th meeting.
