Block of the Month

The end is in sight! Our Block of the Month quilts are nearly complete. All of the piecing for both projects is complete and all that is left is to put on the batting, backing and binding for our **Happy Hues** quilt top and then quilt according to your preference.

If your project is the **He Loves Me**, **He Loves Me Not**, your completion steps are adding the sashing strips, and then the outside borders, if desired, before adding the batting, backing and binding. Because these blocks are stand alone, they lend themselves to many different projects. You can join two or three into a runner, join a few more together, with or without sashing for a wheelchair size lap quilt, or complete as the directions say.

Please plan to bring your completed quilt top or finished project to Quilt Guild on May 19 for a photo of our accomplishments.

For our fellow quilters who may have hearing or visual challenges, please reserve the seats in the front row for our General Meetings.

fabric. We also organized the Conex so we can hopefully find what you need to complete those quilts.

With that said we realized that we have a lot of quilt tops that need backing, 10 large tubs, 12 tubs that need batting and 8 tubs that are ready to be quilted. We could use some help getting these bundles quilted. There are small ones you can try on your domestic machine. If you haven't ever completed a quilt, we can help show you how easy it can be.

You have done a good job on getting backings pieced, down to 3 tubs on that one. At the next meeting we are going to try and get those backs pieced and find backs for some of the tops already done. That means we need a lot of batting. If you have any Hobbs UPC labels, Hobbs is accepting and giving the guild a nice discount. It's the best price we have found but we have used all our labels. Any you have would be appreciated. We also have a lot of new orphan blocks; quilt starts and kits. (Plus, our free to a good home table is growing).

We hope you can come and join us on March 24th. We will have everything out and ready for you at 9:00 am. Bring lunch and sit and sew until 3:00 pm.
