Block of the Month



Happy Spring, Quilters! If you are like me, you are planning summer travel and activities but retaining time in your schedule to enjoy making quilting memories. Please remember, if you participated in the 24-25 year Blocks of the Month, this next meeting is when you bring your quilt top to share with the rest of the group. The designer of the **"He Loves Me, He Loves Me Not"** (the one without any bias edges) requires a photo of the quilts our guild made of her pattern, as a condition of use, so please come ready for a photo.

Speaking of this designer, she has desianed some of the quilts being considered for next year's Blocks of the Month. I'd really value your input on which two quilts to make. You may vote for up to two and either cast your vote by email (I am in the directory) or come to my table during our May meeting and cast your vote in person. These guilts make lovely gifts and can always be Community Quilts donations. Because they are spread out over an entire vear, each month's section is easily accomplished. Additionally, our guild will have a Quilt Show in 2026 and our completed BOMs can be displayed there.

I look forward to your votes and will certainly enjoy making the selected quilts along with you.

Gemtones. This pattern is Accuquilt compatible with the 10" Block Cube and also has rotary cutting directions. Our guild has the 8" Block Cube which will make the quilt design, but the finished size of the blocks would be 12" square instead of 15" square as the directions call for. The pattern, as written, will make a 70 1/2" by 93" finished quilt. If using the 8" Block Accuquilt dies, the finished size would be closer to 58" by 76". This pattern will stretch over 9 months.



Majestic Beauty. This is a traditionally pieced quilt with the blocks set on point. It finishes at 81" square. Each individual block finishes to 13" square. Directions will be given over 10 months.



Hometown Heros. This pattern meets the requirements for Quilt of Valor donations to be given to a service member who has served in war. The finished quilt is 63" by 80 1/2" and the blocks finish to 15 " square. Only 3 fabric colors are used in the quilt and directions will be given over 10 months.



Midnight Stargazer. This quilt features 12" finished blocks with a 3 1/2 " border all around. It is traditionally pieced and the whole quilt finishes to 67" by 79". Directions will be given over 10 months.



Graceful Garden. This quilt finishes to 81" square. It is traditionally pieced with a central medallion that finishes to 36" square and is surrounded by 18" square blocks. Directions will be given over 10 months.
